EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE:

Through the Demo Lab Loaner Bank, devices are available for individuals who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing to try before they buy:

- Alarm clocks
- Doorbell and alerting devices
- Assistive listening devices
- Amplified phones and using Voice Carry Over (VCO) and Hearing Carry Over (HCO)
- TTY
- TV listening systems
- Other adaptive equipment to meet the needs at home or work

INFORMATION & REFERRAL:

Staff of the Sanderson Community Center and Southern Utah Program can provide information on types of equipment available for individuals who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing, referral for resources to purchase needed equipment as well as to a program providing equipment to individuals who qualify.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The Assistive Technology program under the Division of Services to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DSDHH) provides services to individuals who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing who could benefit from use of assistive technology at home or work. The services include installation, repair, consultation and a loan program.

CONSULTATION:

When an individual has a need for assistive equipment in their home or workplace, he or she may call the Assistive Technology Specialist to come and evaluate their environment for assistive technology needs.

INSTALLATION:

When an individual acquires assistive devices, the client may request the Assistive Technology Specialist to properly install devices to suit their needs.





REPAIR:

An individual having purchased an assistive device may contact the Assistive Technology Program for assistance with the repair of devices that are not working properly.

LOAN PROGRAM:

The Assistive Technology program will loan assistive devices to individuals to use while their equipment is being repaired. The Loan Program may also assist those who have an immediate need for Assistive Technology until they are able to acquire their own equipment.
